Looking to Escape

weryone knows the importance of making a good first impression. But does that apply to a new vehicle on a dealer's lot? Absolutely, according to Ben Topping of Newport News.

"My wife, Faye, and I decided we needed a new vehicle for traveling back and forth from our other home in Natural Bridge," says Topping. So, he made a list of dealers in the area that he had heard good things about and Freedom Ford of Hampton (757/838-0222) was first on that list.

"I pulled into the lot and noticed quite a gathering of people around a red SUV," says Topping. "From where I stood, I could see that the sticker said it was a Ford Escape and it looked like it had a lot of the features that I wanted." What he didn't realize was that he was admiring the first Escape on the Peninsula. But, Topping wanted to keep looking. "So I spent five hours that day driving around to the other dealerships," he says. "But I found I was comparing everything else to the Escape."

"The next day, I went to see [salesperson] Tony Shultz at Freedom Ford," says Topping. "Tony was very patient with me. I told him I was looking for a vehicle with good gas mileage, automatic transmission, a V-6 engine and four-wheel drive." Shultz showed him trucks, vans, SUVs and cars, "Then I asked him about the Escape. Come

The 2001 Ford Escape is available in two trim levels: the XLS and XLT with two- or four-wheel drive. The manufacturer's suggested retail price

Once inside, it was the roominess that really surprised Topping. "Our dog and cat go everywhere we go," he says. "So, we needed space for them, too. All we do is fold down the rear seat and we have room for us, the animals and any antiques we decide to pick up." With the rear seats removed, the Escape offers 68.5 cubic feet of cargo, according to Edmunds.com.

Topping also had a number of options installed including: side step bars, AM/FM stereo with cassette and CD player, perimeter alarm, retractable cargo cover, floor mats, speed control and four-speed automatic transmission with a 3.0liter, V-6 engine. "The power of the V-6 is what I was really interested in," says Topping. "The Escape handles beautifully on the flat of the interstate and the challenges of the mountains and the four-wheel drive will get us through the snow."

Topping laughs about choosing the Ford Escape. "I didn't even know this vehicle existed before I saw it on the lot," he muses. "But the next day when I returned to the dealership. I knew I had found the vehicle I wanted. It fits all of our needs. I couldn't have asked for a better vehicle if I'd sat down and ordered one myself."


