

A Guide to
Campus Living

Troy University provides a great place to live and learn. This guide will help you explore the many on-campus living opportunities and dining experiences offered at Troy. The goal of Troy University's residence halls is to provide a balance of educational, recreational and leadership opportunities. From traditional dormitories and apartments to private rooms and suites, Troy's campus has housing certain to fit your lifestyle and needs.

Alumni Hall

Alumni Hall is the University's largest traditional male residence hall with 250 rooms. Features include:

- Double-occupancy rooms with moveable beds, as well as built-in desks, chests of drawers, shelves and storage space
- Large recreation room with billiard table and big-screen TV
- Large study room and meeting room
- Private rooms on a space-available basis



Clements Hall

Renovated in 2004, James Burns Clements Hall features 84 suite-style rooms in a

residential hall for men and women.

Features include:

- Double-occupancy and some triple-occupancy rooms with moveable beds, as well as built-in desks, closet space and storage space
- Private rooms on a space-available basis



The Benefits of Living on Campus:

CONVENIENCE The library, academic buildings, dining halls and Trojan Student Center are within walking distance.

SECURITY University Police patrol the campus 24/7 by foot, bicycle and car. "Drive-home" service is available and most halls utilize an access-card system for additional peace-of-mind.

COST Living on campus is economical. Utilities, cable TV, Internet access and local phone service are included in the semester rent.

FRIENDSHIPS You are part of a community. Making friends is easier when you share living experiences with people in your hall.

BETTER GRADES Research shows Troy students living on campus have higher GPAs than those living off campus. On-campus living provides more interaction with professors and academic advisors who can help and motivate you.

While no two Troy residence halls are exactly alike, each is designed for the comfort and safety of students. All residence halls are air-conditioned and feature lounges, study rooms, cable television, Internet and phone hookups, laundry and vending facilities, as well as a micro/fridge appliance.

Dill Hall

Joseph Macon Dill Hall is a 50-unit, on-campus apartment complex designed primarily for upperclassmen.

Features include:

- Single-occupancy efficiency apartments and one- and two-bedroom units for up to four people
- Carpeted rooms include private bathroom with moveable beds, desks, chests of drawers, as well as closet space
- Fully equipped kitchen
- Meal plan not required. All utilities included in rent



Gardner Hall

Catherine Collins Gardner Hall, conveniently located near the Trojan Student Center, is a 63-room traditional residence hall primarily for freshmen women.



Features include:

- Double-occupancy rooms with moveable beds, desks and chests of drawers



General Residence Policy:

All unmarried students who have not turned 19 prior to the first day of registration in the semester for which they are enrolled are required to live on campus for the entire academic year or the remaining portion thereof, unless recognized by the University in writing as living with a parent at a stated home address. Home addresses must be within a reasonable commuting distance. For specific commuting information, please contact the Residence Life Office.


NOTE: All students residing in University Housing are required to retain their residence for the entire academic year, or remaining portion thereof, unless they withdraw from the University, provided, however, if a student withdraws from but then returns to the University during the same academic year, the student will be required to live on campus for the remaining portion of said year. This policy shall not apply to married students.



Hamil Hall

Lorraine Estelle Hamil Hall is a traditional residence hall housing 147 women. Conveniently located near the Trojan Student Center and most academic buildings, Hamil Hall also houses the Health Center and University Police Department. Features include:

- Double-occupancy rooms with moveable beds, built-in desks and chests of drawers



Honors House

Housing only ten students, this co-ed hall features single-occupancy rooms and a fully equipped kitchen shared by all residents. Residents must be a part of the University Honors Program.



Features include:

- Carpeted rooms with moveable beds, desks and chests of drawer.
- Large living room area shared by all residents



Other Cool Stuff...

McDowell Lee Natatorium and Outdoor Pool

Our Natatorium has a beautiful, Olympic-sized, indoor, heated pool available to students for swimming, classes, water aerobics and intramural activities like water polo. From early spring to late fall, students also have access to a heated, outdoor pool complete with wooden sun deck, snack bar and locker room facilities.

Cowart Hall**

Fletcher Jackson Cowart Hall houses 120 women and is conveniently located near all academic buildings. Cowart is primarily for upperclassmen.

Features include:

- Suite-style, double-occupancy rooms with shared bathrooms between two rooms



- Carpeted rooms with moveable beds, desks and chests of drawers, as well as closet space
- Building has an elevator and is completely ADA-accessible



Pace Hall**

Pace Hall/Rotary International Center is a co-ed residence hall where American and international students reside. This multicultural experience features suites/apartments for men and women.

Features include:

- Four different-size suites

for one, two or four residents

- Shared kitchen and bathrooms within each suite
- Movable beds, desks and chests of drawers
- No meal plan required

Trojan Oaks Golf and Racquet Club



Twelve lighted tennis courts and an on-campus, nine-hole championship golf course are available to challenge students throughout the year. Golf and tennis equipment are available for sale at the Pro Shop.

Claudia Crosby Theater

Located in Smith Hall, this 1,000-seat theater hosts orchestra performances, concerts, plays and special events throughout the year. In addition, movies are also shown free of charge to students.

Hill Crest House & Paden House**

These contemporary, colonial-style houses are reserved for students committed to substance-free living and a wellness



lifestyle. Hill Crest house is a 16-bed male residence hall. Paden House is an 18-bed female residence hall.

Features include:

- Private, double- and triple-occupancy carpeted suites with private bathrooms for each suite
- Rooms include moveable beds, wooden desks and chests of drawers, as well as closet space
- Living area and student activity rooms



Shackelford Hall**

Shackelford Hall offers modern amenities and features one-, two-, three- and four-bedroom suites with some private rooms available.

Features include:

- Suites share a bathroom between rooms, except in private rooms
- Rooms include beds, chests of drawers, desks, bookshelves, closet space, and a micro/fridge appliance
- Study rooms, common kitchen area, fitness rooms, meeting rooms and sorority chapter rooms available



University Apartments**

Primarily devoted to married students, University Apartments' 48 units are located four blocks from campus. Single parents, graduate students or University Staff may be assigned.

Features include:

- 24 carpeted one-bedroom and 24 two-bedroom unfurnished apartments
- Open areas for children
- Fully equipped kitchen
- Meal plan not required. Utilities not included in rent associated with apartments

CAMPUS DINING
 Troy Residence Life offers four meal plans to allow students to choose the one that best fits. On-campus dining provides delicious, affordable meals at two locations. Stewart Dining Hall offers SAGA and Frank's Place.

Frank's Place Frank's Place is a favorite late-night spot with its casual dining, hardwood floors and TVs. The menu includes grilled, steamed and fried foods with a full-service soda fountain.

SAGA SAGA is an all-you-care-to-eat restaurant with an extensive soup and salad bar, wellness line for the health conscious, hot-off-the-grill burgers and fries, pizza buffet and home-style meals.

Trojan Express

Located inside the Trojan Student Center, the Trojan Express Food Court features a wide variety of restaurants to satisfy cravings for home-cooked meals served buffet style to made-to-order sandwiches. Restaurants include: Chick-Fil-A, Freshen's Yogurt, Ice Cream and Bakery, Starbuck's Coffee, the Marketplace and Grecian Bistro. Set in a comfortable coffeehouse atmosphere, the Trojan Express also has ten TVs and six computer stations with free Internet access.

Trojan Games Students love unwinding in our large game room featuring eight pool tables, ping-pong tables and video games.


The University Store From textbooks, school supplies and computer equipment, to TROY apparel, merchandise and souvenirs, the University Store has it all.

Trojan Center Theater This beautiful 285-seat theater serves as a venue for on-campus theatrical and musical productions.

Trojan Fitness Center This state-of-the-art facility features free weights, weight training equipment by Nautilus and Hammerstrength and an aerobics room. The Center boasts the latest cardiovascular exercise equipment, each with headsets hard-wired to TVs located around the room. Aerobics and kickboxing classes are available and the aerobics room is equipped with three TVs and a library of exercise videos. The Center also offers personal instruction and customized training programs. All Center services and aerobics classes are free to Troy students.
